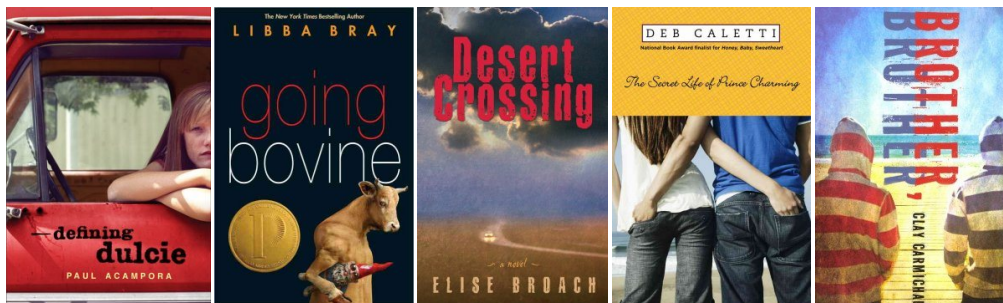


Road Trips

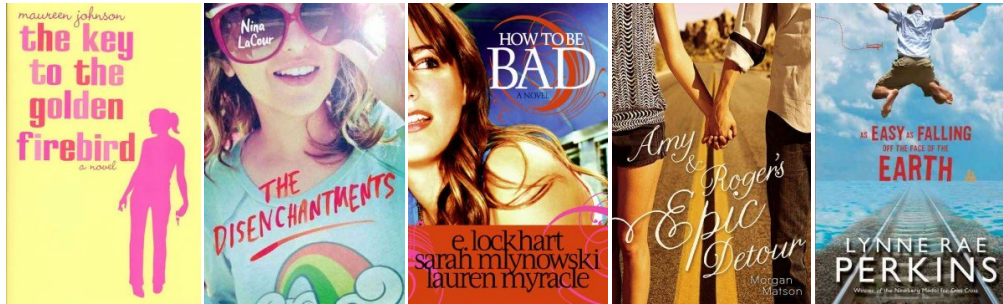
Cadillac Chronicles by Brett Hartman
