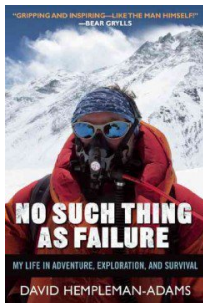

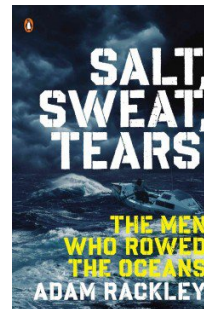

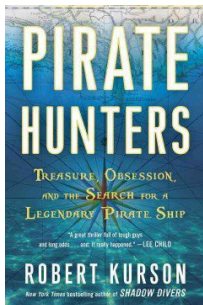
NO SUCH THING AS FAILURE

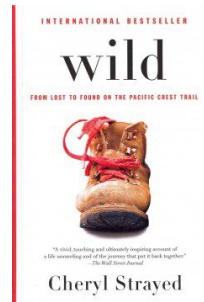
SALT, SWEAT, TEARS

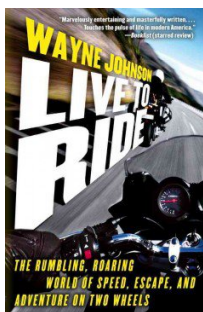
PIRATE HUNTERS

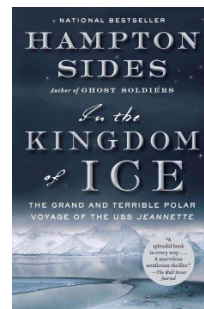
WILD
