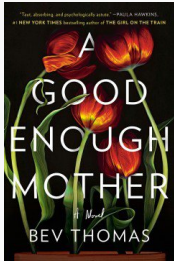
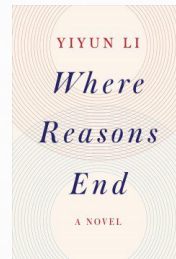

When a new patient looks exactly like her missing son, a therapist is determined to help him, but she begins to cross some dangerous boundaries.



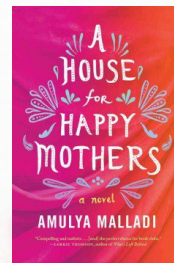
Where Reasons End by Yiyun Li

A tribute to the love and complexities of parent-child bonds that reimagines an urgent conversation between a mother and teenage son after suicide.



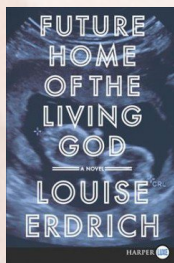
Look How Happy I'm Making You by Polly Rosenwaike

A collection that explores the realities of early motherhood, including fertility problems, single parenthood, and the challenges of infant care.



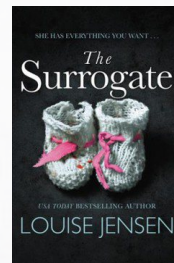
A House for Happy Mothers by Amulya Malladi

In trendy Silicon Valley, Priya has everything she needs—a loving husband, a career, and a home—but the one thing she wants most is the child she's unable to have.



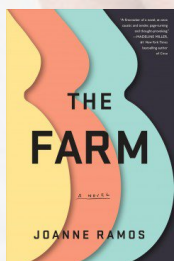
Future Home of the Living God by Louise Erdrich

A tale set in a world of reversing evolution follows the efforts of a pregnant woman who investigates her biological family while awaiting the birth of a child.



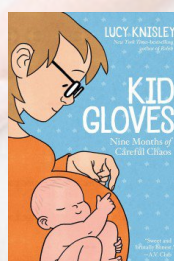
The Surrogate by Louise Jensen
