



while demonstrating how technological innovations ranging from the mortar and pestle to the microwave have shaped how and what we eat.

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

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

by Imbolo Mbue


Two marriages, one from the immigrant working class and the other from the top one percent, are shaped by financial circumstances, infidelities, secrets and the 2008 recession.




### Good Omens

The world is going to end next Saturday, but there are a couple of problems--the Antichrist has been misplaced, and the representatives from heaven and


hell decide that they like the human race. An amiably zany novel of religious and social satire by masters of science fiction Gaiman and Pratchett.

by Anthony Horowitz



by Hugh Laurie






### The Trouble With Goats And Sheep: A Novel




