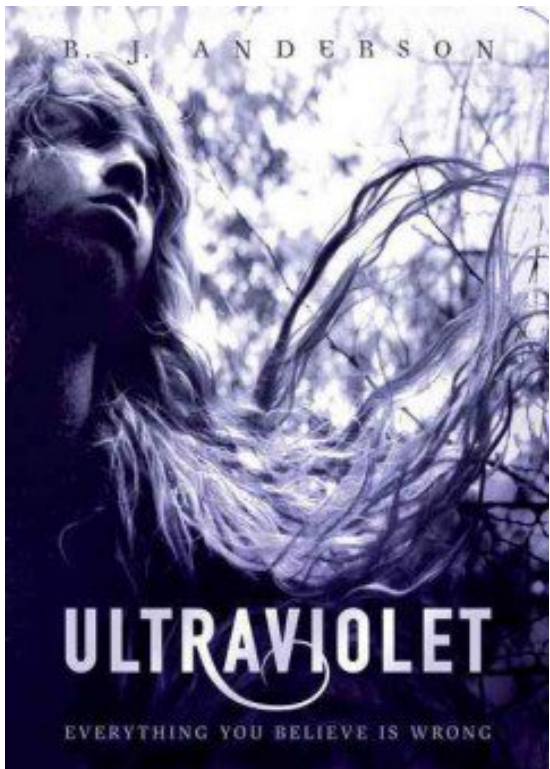


Teen Book Reviews
