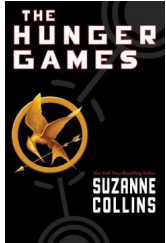

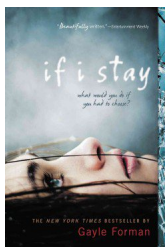

by Suzanne Collins

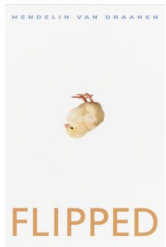

by Gayle Forman

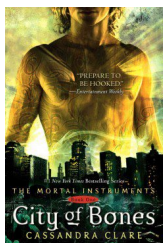
With no memory of the car accident itself, 17-year-old Mia must come to terms with never really knowing what happened one horrific winter's day that changed her life forever.

by Cassandra Clare

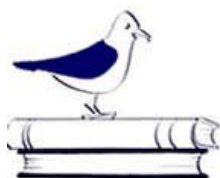
