

- For every 100 pages read, your Reading Account will be credited 1 (one) Library Buck. (maximum 100 Library Bucks).

Click on "Summer Reading Sign-up"

- You may **only count books** that you have started on or after Sunday, **May 29, 2016**.
- You may only record a book one time. **No phone-in recording.** All books must be recorded on the Library's website, either from a home computer or at the library on one of our computers.
- You **must bring** recorded books into the library for staff review in order to receive credit for the pages. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** If we don't see you WITH the book you recorded, you **WILL NOT** get credit for those pages.
- No more than 1000 pages may be recorded before you are required to bring the books to the library for staff review; **although you may bring them in at any time**, staff may put a stop on your record if you disregard this rule. You must be prepared for a *random* verbal report. (Those not following the rules will be removed from the program).
- **Books read & recorded must have font type that is no larger than 15 points.** Font templates are available at the library. **Also, no pages with pictures may be counted** (except at the beginning of chapters).

Students registering for Summer Reading Program must live (or their parents must own property) in *Plymouth, Center, Polk, North, or West Townships*, OR have a paid out-of-township card *purchased* at Plymouth Public Library, OR a PLAC card with an additional \$5.00 fee, OR be a reciprocal borrower and pay an additional \$5.00 fee.

Information for the Grade the Child Completed

Infant-Preschool: Parents read books to their child. Prizes are awarded at 20 book intervals. If you read 100 books you complete the program!

Kindergarten and 1st Grade: Children if able, should read grade appropriate books by themselves. Prizes are awarded at 15 book intervals. If you read 75 books you complete the program! Board books are reserved for the Infant-Preschool level. You can record a title only once.

2nd & 3rd Grade: Students read grade appropriate books by themselves. Prizes are awarded at 8 book intervals. If you read 40 books you complete the program! You can record a title only once.

4th & 5th Grade: Students read **TWEEN** level books themselves. You can record a title only once. You earn 1 point by finishing 4 books. No graphic novels. Please pick up Official Rules at the Library or print them from the link on your log.
