


Video games are available for check out! Xbox, Wii, & PS3 games. Check out for 1 week for \$2 per game, 2 game limit.

► No more than 1000 pages may be recorded before you are <u>required</u> to bring the books to the ibrary for staff review; although you may bring them in at any time, staff may put a stop on your record if you disregard this rule. You must be prepared for a *random* verbal report. (Those not following the rules will be removed from the program).

Books read & recorded must have font type that is no larger than 15 points. Font templates are available at the ibrary. Also, no pages with pictures may be counted (except at the beginning of chapters).

Students registering for Summer Reading Program must live (or their parents must own property) in Plymouth Center, Polk, North, or West Townships, OR have a paid out-of-township card purchased at Plymouth Public Library, OR a PLAC card with an additional \$5.00 fee, OR be a reciprocal borrower and pay an additional \$5.00 fee.

*BE SURE TO READ requirements for each reading program. They are posted in the programs when you sign up and record your books.

*Registrants for Summer Reading Programs must have a PPL library card in good standing. Library cards are free for people living in Plymouth city limits, Center or West townships. Polk & North townships are able to get a PPL card according to trustee's agreements. Ask at Adult Circulation desk for information. PLAC or reciprocal borrowers may participate by having a PPL card in good standing and paying a small fee.

*Fun prizes will be awarded. All readers may choose from an aisle that has prizes. Food coupons and prizes will be awarded upon availability while supplies last.
