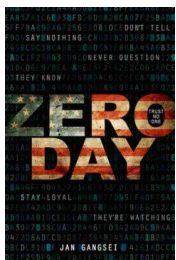
Emmy & Oliver

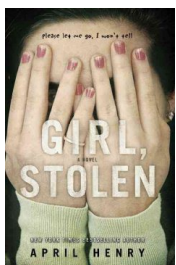
The Bunker Diary

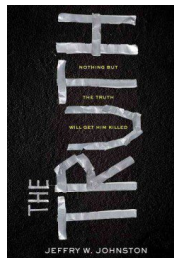
Stolen

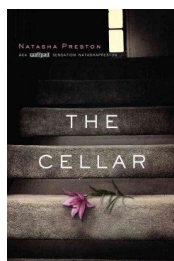
Girl, Stolen

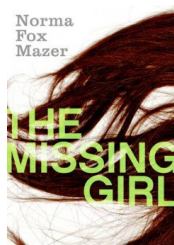
The Truth

After shooting an intruder in his home, Chris is taken and held hostage by the brother of the thirteen-year-old intruder who demands to know exactly what happened the night of the shooting



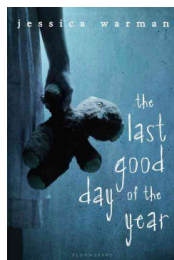
Kill the Boy Band
