




Chime


does not know about.

Discovering that they both dated the same boy when they attend his funeral, two girls travel the world to uncover the young man's secrets only to realize that they are harboring a few of their own.




The Art of Secrets


question each other's motives.

by Stephanie Kuehn



by E. Lockhart


Follows the revolutionary activities of four friends who turn against each other in the wake of trauma, differing political views and a devastating secret.
