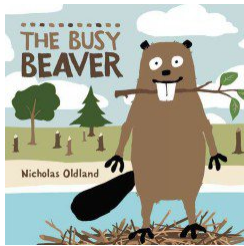
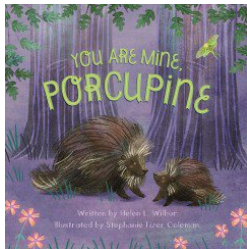

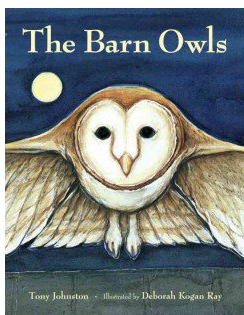


**The Busy Beaver**

A beaver is so busy that he becomes careless about the trees he fells in the forest and how he completes his dams, until a trip to the hospital changes his outlook on his carelessness

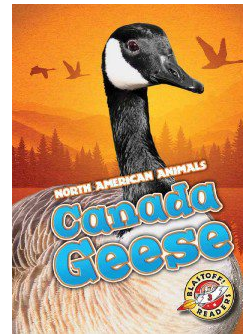


**You Are Mine, Porcupine**

Rhymes and lively wordplay combine with high-detail artwork in a STEM-based account of a night in the life of a young porcupine that incorporates facts about its environment, eating

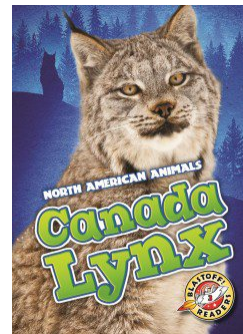
habits and physical attributes.



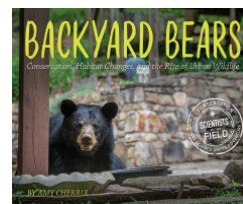
**The Barn Owls**
