

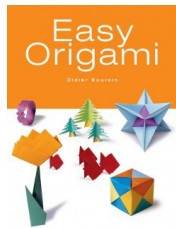

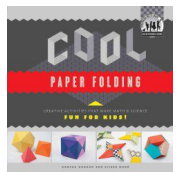

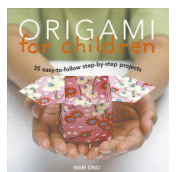
Adult learners: don't be shy about borrowing books from the children's area. Children's books are clearly worded and illustrated, making learning a new skill or craft a bit easier for beginners.



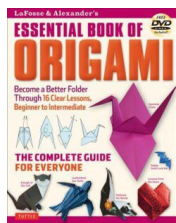
Easy Origami

Beginning with general tips on getting started and obtaining the best results, easy-to-follow directions take beginners step-by-step through the process of creating 24 projects.



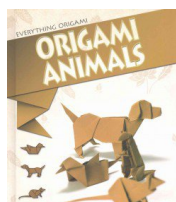
Cool Paper Folding

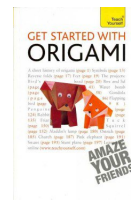
