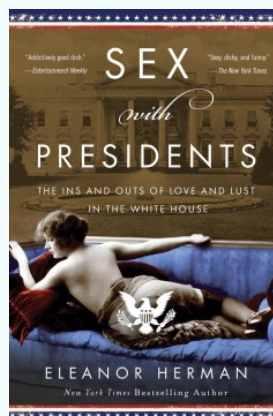
Mad Honey
