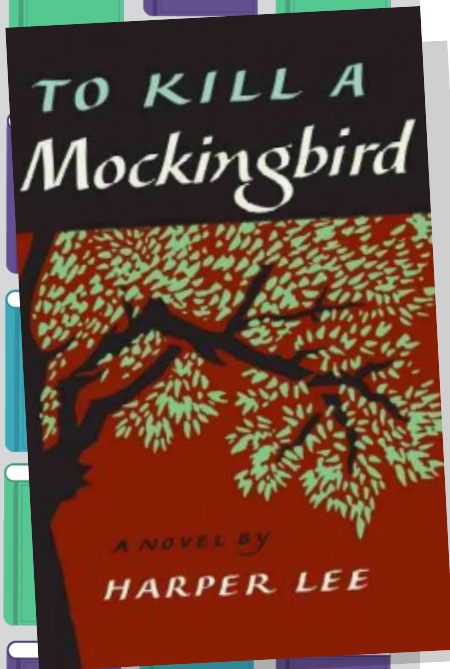

To Kill a Mocking Bird

To Kill a Mockingbird is a captivating tale of life in southern Alabama in the 1930s. I would definitely recommend this book to all teens! In *To Kill a Mockingbird*, Harper Lee investigates many different themes including innocence, stereotypes, discrimination, and injustice. This book is told through the eyes of six-year-old Scout Finch whose father, Atticus, is a lawyer. Atticus, unlike the rest of his neighbors, is not prejudiced. He gets into an impossible case challenging the racial discrimination in Maycomb County, Alabama. Scout and her brother Jem explore the opinions and segregation in their neighborhood and how strongly discriminated the community is. Throughout this book, Scout and Jem grow up and learn about reality from which they have been hidden for so long. This book has deep messages, profound themes, and a higher-level vocabulary, so I would recommend this book for ages 12+.
