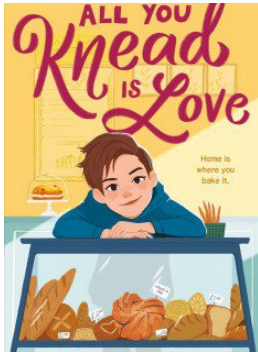

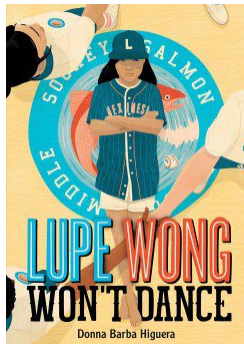

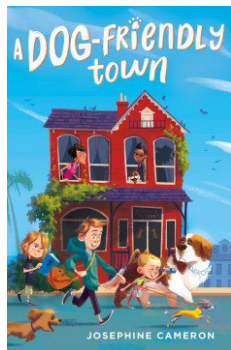


Lupe Wong Won't Dance

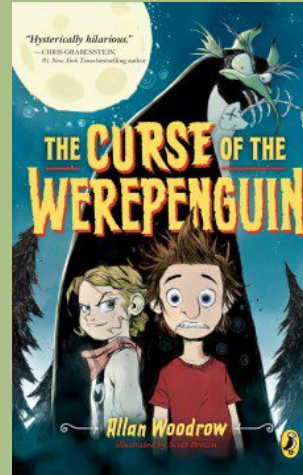

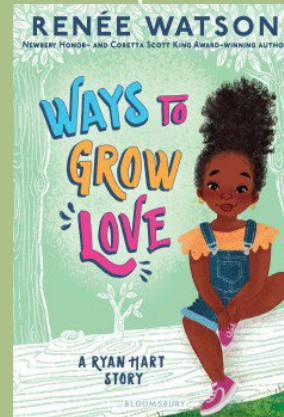


Curse of the WerePenguin
