1 Moving up: accessible navigation links



We continue to focus on making LibraryAware accessible for all users, and our next step will be updating your system navigation links. We're moving all the links you use to get around in LibraryAware -- Promotions, Subscribers, etc. -- to the top black bar in navigation.

We're also adding an icon at the far right of the navigation bar that you can click to find out what's new in LibraryAware.
