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BOOK ADVENTURE: EVERYDAY ART

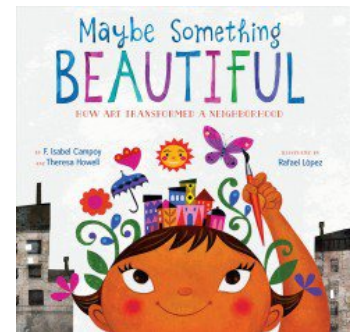
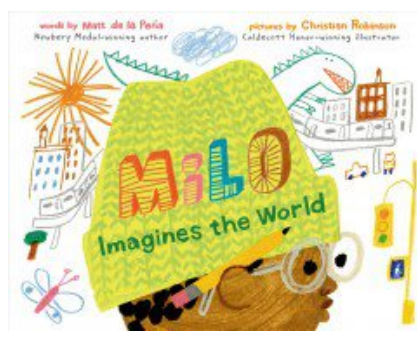
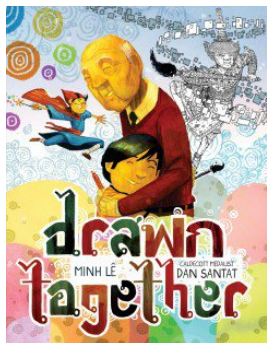
World of shapes. Look all around you: What shapes do you see? How many squares can you find? How many circles? How many triangles?

Get colorful. If you were a color today, what color would you be and why? What objects can you find at home or outside that are also that color?

Nature collage. Take a walk to collect some natural materials: leaves, twigs, grass, flowers, etc. Glue them on paper to make a special picture.

Scribble creature. Find something to draw with and something to draw on (crayons and paper? chalk and a sidewalk?), and draw a pretend scribble creature. Use your favorite colors, shapes and lines. Give your creature a name.
