



1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is a nationwide effort to encourage parents and caregivers of children ages 0 to 5 to make reading aloud a daily priority.

IS IT REALLY POSSIBLE TO READ 1,000 BOOKS?

Yes! Try these methods and see how easy it is:

Bedtime Story Method

By reading just one bedtime story each night, you can read 1,000 books in less than three years.

15-Minute Method

Most board books and picture books take 5 minutes or less to read. By reading 3 books aloud with your child each day – about 15 minutes – you'll finish 1,095 books in a year.

WHICH BOOKS COUNT TOWARD OUR GOAL?

All board books, picture books, and stories your child hears at home, at storytime, at preschool or day care, or even at a grandparent's house count toward your 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten reading goal. Reading a book multiple times counts, too.
