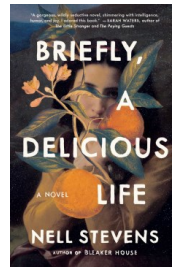

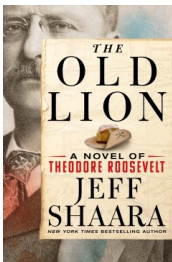


Defending Alice

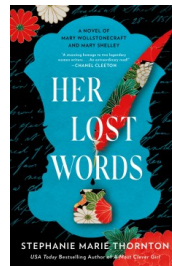


The Old Lion: A Novel of Theodore Roosevelt

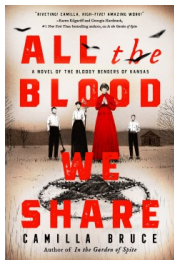

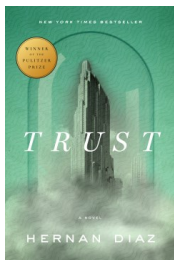


All the Blood We Share

The family of a gifted medium who can receive messages from beyond are welcomed by the town of Cherrvale, but no one knows about their other business.

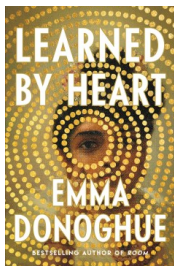


Trust

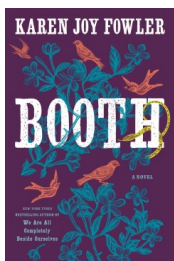


Learned by Heart

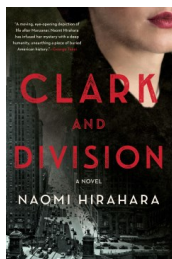


Booth

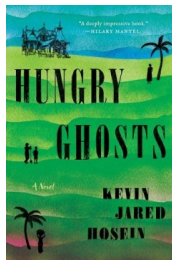


Clark and Division

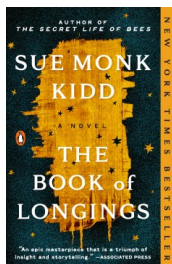


Hungry Ghosts

The fates of three women become intertwined by their belief in the power and goodness in the written word and its ability to triumph over the very darkest moments of World War II.

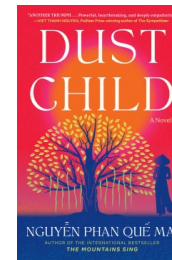


Looking for Jane

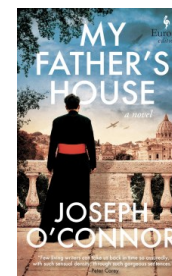


Dust Child

The abandoned son of a Black American soldier and a Vietnamese woman during the war dreams of finding his family and a better life.

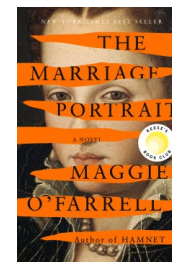


My Father's House
