



As Newland Archer prepares to marry docile May Welland, the return of the mysterious Countess Olenska turns his life upside down.




The Picture of Dorian Gray

The handsome appearance of a dissolute, young Dorian Gray remains unchanged while the features in his portrait become distorted as he degenerates.




When Lenina and Bernard visit a savage reservation, they experience how utopia can destroy humanity.




The War of the Worlds








Sense and Sensibility

In 19th-century England, two sisters are drawn into unhappy romances despite the cool judgement of one and the emotional intensity of the other.




Wuthering Heights

The passionate love of Catherine Earnshaw and Heathcliff mirrors the powerful moods of the Yorkshire moors.




The Ingenious Hidalgo Don Quixote De La Mancha

Retells the adventures of an eccentric country gentleman and his companion who set out as knight and squire of old to right wrongs and punish evil.




Our Mutual Friend

John Harmon discovers that by a curious quirk in his father's will he must marry Bella Wilfer, a girl he has never met, in order to claim his inheritance.




The Count of Monte Cristo

Edmund Dantes, unjustly convicted of aiding the exiled Napoleon, escapes after 14 years of imprisonment and seeks revenge in Paris.




Invisible Man




North and South

Margaret Hale is taken from the wealthy south by her nonconformist, minister father, to live in a fictional northern town.




To Kill a Mockingbird

A young girl growing up in an Alabama town in the 1930s learns of injustice and violence when her father, a widowed lawyer, defends a Black man falsely accused of rape.




Animal Farm
