


Ultrabot's First Playdate

Charley gets teased for daydreaming and drawing more than his friends, but when he meets Emma, who is physically different, he needs help remembering that being different is okay.




Spencer's New Pet

Young readers are introduced to a wide variety of birds, their feathers, and Plume, the cat that is stalking them.








A Fox Found a Box




When Numbers Met Letters

When Ben's cat disappears into the gutter of the book, Ben realizes it's up to him to set things right.




Hair Love




Dandy

A fastidious daddy lion races against time and the mockery of his friends to rid his perfectly manicured lawn of a solitary dandelion weed that his daughter loves.




The Bold, Brave Bunny




Nobody Hugs a Cactus




Swim Swim Sink

An adorable little duckling sinks during his first swimming lesson and tries over and over again to learn how to swim.




I Can Only Draw Worms

This is a laugh-out-loud counting story of a growing number of worms (the only thing the illustrator can draw) and their adventures.




Linus the Little Yellow Pencil
