

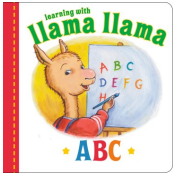

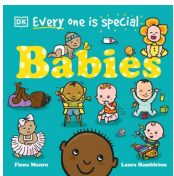


Llama Llama ABC

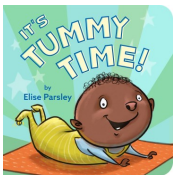

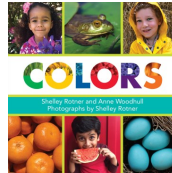


Splash!

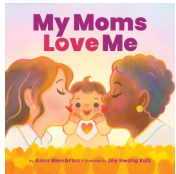

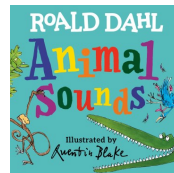


The Very Hungry Caterpillar Eats Dinner

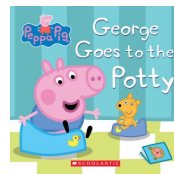


Animal Sounds

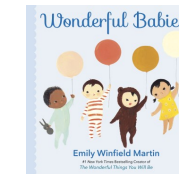


Good Night, Baby

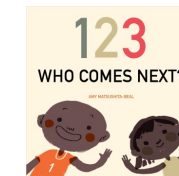


Wonderful Babies
