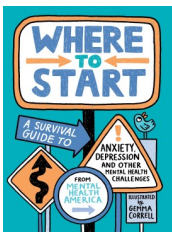

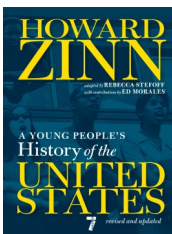

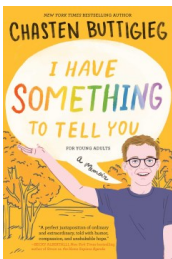


### A Young People's History of the United States

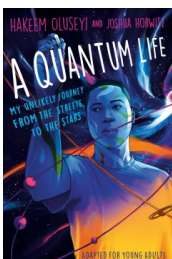


### I Have Something to Tell You

An American astrophysicist chronicles his troubled childhood and the destructive habits that almost derailed his career, sharing how he persevered to realize his dreams.

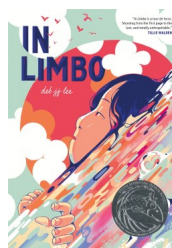


### Bomb

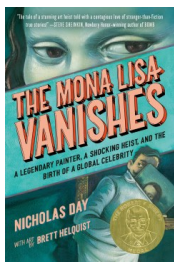

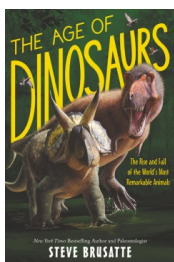


### The Mona Lisa Vanishes

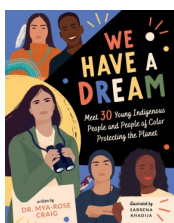


### The Age of Dinosaurs

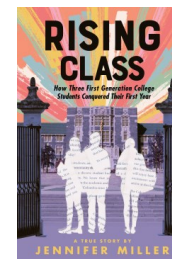


### Revolution in Our Time

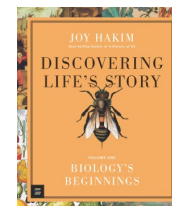
