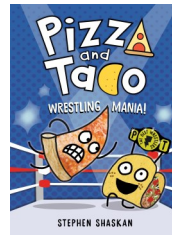

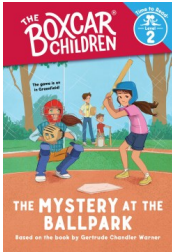


Pizza and Taco: Wrestling Mania!

Pizza's and Taco's moms want them to join a sports team, so when they see the wrestling sign-up sheet at school, they want to join the club.



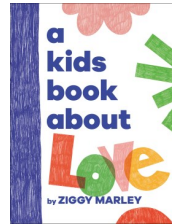

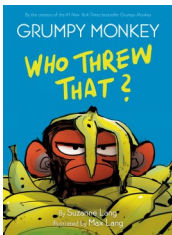


Hooray for DNA!: How a Bear and a Bug Are a Lot Like Us

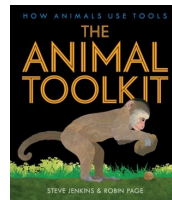


Grumpy Monkey: Who Threw That?

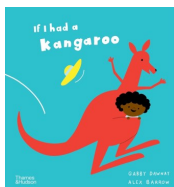

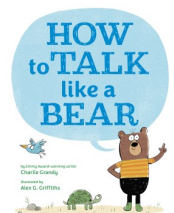


Mina

A young bear gives instructions on how to talk like a bear, which is far more than just growling and roaring.

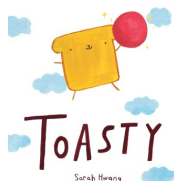


Bubbly Beautiful Kitty-Corn

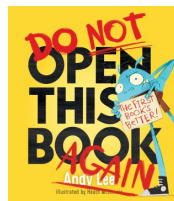


Toasty
