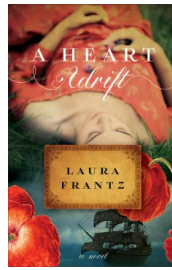

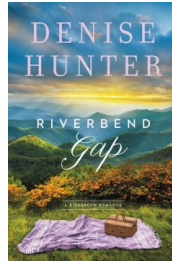
A married couple, haunted by the tragedy of their adult daughter's death, raise their grandson and try to put their lives back in order even if it means separating for a time and missing their old life.

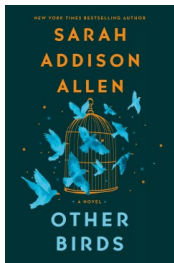


The Reading List

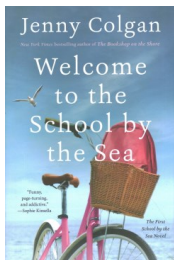


Other Birds

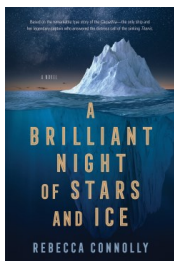


Welcome to the School By the Sea

At Downey House, new teacher Maggie is determined to make her mark, which jeopardizes her relationship with her safe, dependable boyfriend.

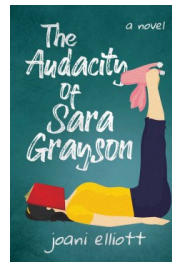


A Brilliant Night of Stars and Ice

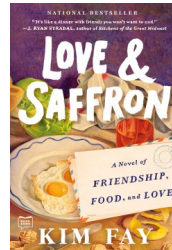


The Audacity of Sara Grayson

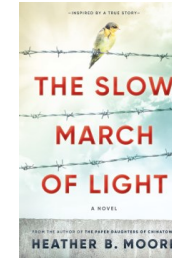


The Pavilion in the Clouds

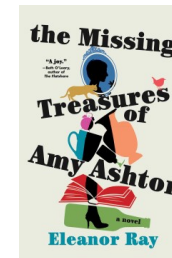


The Slow March of Light

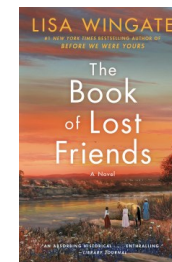


The Missing Treasures of Amy Ashton
