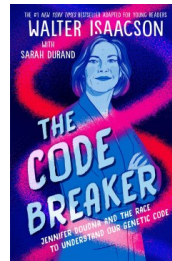


## Race Against Time

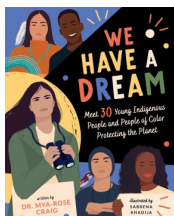


### Spooked!

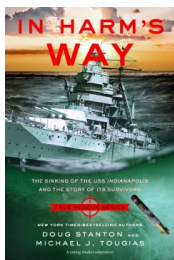


### We Have a Dream

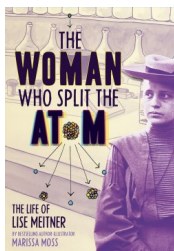


### In Harm's Way

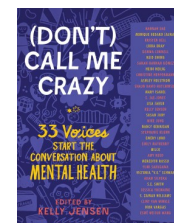
