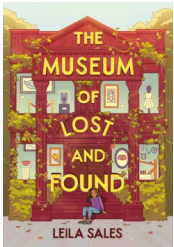

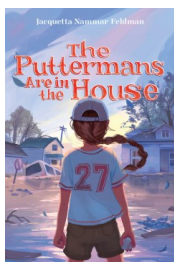


The Selkie's Daughter

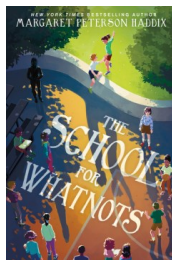


The Puttermans Are in the House

When their house is damaged in a flood, twins Sammy and Matty Putterman move in with their cousin Becky, discovering they all need each other now more than ever.

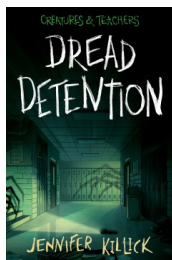


The School for Whatnots

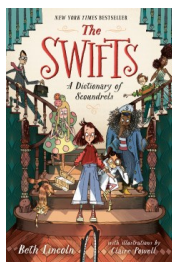


Good Different

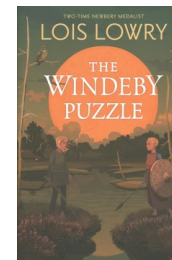


The Swifts: A Dictionary of Scoundrels

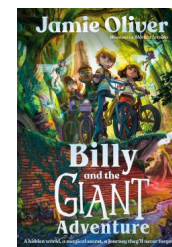


The Firefly Summer

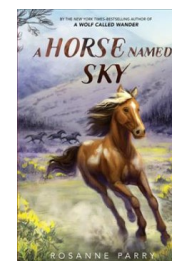


Billy and the Giant Adventure
