


The Delight of Being Ordinary




A Place For Us

An historical novel that brings to life the story of America's first female state senator, who was also a doctor, suffragist, and champion of public health in Utah in the 19th century.




The Glovemaker

It's 1888: Deborah waits for her overdue husband to return from his travels when a desperate stranger shows up seeking refuge, turning her life upside down.




The Beauty of Your Face








Daughter of Rome




The Fifth Avenue Story Society




The Next Person You Meet in Heaven

The story of a grizzled war veteran turned amusement park mechanic who has a spiritual reunion with the girl he died rescuing.




Little Faith

A Wisconsin family grapples with the power and limitations of faith when an adult daughter falls under the influence of a radical church that threatens a grandchild's safety.




Siddhartha




Kaddish.com




A Flame in the Dark: A Novel About Luther's Reformation




Between Two Shores
